Three Year Degrees for Admission to Graduate Programs

Overview

Admission to ASU graduate programs requires the applicant to have earned a four year U.S. bachelors degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution or international equivalent. While most three year bachelor's degrees are not considered equivalent to a U.S. four year bachelor's degree, we will evaluate three year bachelor's degrees for acceptability for admission review. Those evaluated as acceptable for admission review will move forward to the department for an admission decision.

Acceptable three year programs must be considered to be bachelor's degrees in the country in which the degree was awarded. We do not consider three year diploma programs to be acceptable for admission review.

Three year degrees are awarded in many regions, most notably, but not exclusively, in the Bologna region of Europe, francophone Africa, India, Canada, and Australia.

Where the student's credential is considered acceptable for admission review but not equivalent to a four year U.S. bachelor's degree, the ADAQ student group will be added to the student's file.

Bologna compliant degrees

Most Bologna agreement countries operate the 3+2 system (3 year undergraduate program and a 2 year graduate program). The Bologna framework was designed and developed to allow transparency for students applying to programs between the Bologna member countries. Bachelor's degrees require 180 ECTS credits over 3 years, Master's degrees require 60-120 credits over 1-2 years, and the Doctorate requires 180+ credits over 3 years.

Bachelor's degrees awarded as part of this system are typically focused on intensive study on the chosen subject. For this reason it is increasingly considered that international applicants holding bachelor's degrees from the Bologna regions may be prepared to study graduate level programs in the United States, taking the following into consideration:

- 1. Undergraduate degree should be in similar subject field
- 2. Students should be admissible to the next level of study within the same country upon award of their undergraduate degree. i.e. Bachelor > Master
- 3. Must be awarded by institutions permitted by the government to award degrees in the country in which the institution is located.
- 4. Two year Master's degrees awarded within the Bologna process framework, within the same country, are considered to be equivalent to U.S. Master's degrees.

Francophone Africa: The License - Master - Doctorate (LMD system)

The systems of higher education in Africa have been heavily influenced by the English and French systems. Traditionally, Francophone countries have traditionally mirrored the French system of four year undergraduate degrees, while Anglophone countries have worked to the English system of A-Levels for admission to a three or four year bachelor's degree programs.

The adoption of the Bologna Process within Europe, which has seen most European higher education systems move to a three year undergraduate degree, two year master's degree and a three year doctoral degree, has influenced similar reforms within Francophone Africa. The aim of such reform is to encourage the mobility of students, tailor higher education to the needs of the workplace, and to harmonize the quality assurance across participating nations. Reforms were required to be implemented regionally, nationally and institutionally. LMD systems have been in place since 2016.

Credentials issued within the LMD system consist of credits which mirror Bologna compliant degrees; therefore, bachelor's degrees are completed in 180 credits over 3 years, Master's degrees in 60-120 credits over 1-2 years, and Doctorate degrees in of 180+ credits over 3 years.

The widespread implementation of LMD has been challenging with resistance to reform at the institutional level being reported by <u>Conseil Africain et Malgache pour L'enseignement Supérieur (CAMES)</u>

Further Information

Conseil Africain et Malgache pour L'enseignement Supérieur (CAMES) was created in 1968 and is primarily responsible for coordinating member countries in their implementation and standardization of the LMD reforms in higher education. CAMES also provides programmatic recognition of degrees issued by institutions located within member countries.

India

Students complete their secondary education after year 12, which is equivalent to a U.S. high school diploma. Traditionally, following a system modeled on the English system of higher education, BA, BSc., or B.Com., degrees awarded by Indian institutions are of three years duration. Like Bologna compliant degrees, Indian three year degrees typically feature intensive study in the major subject and as such students may be considered to be prepared to successfully complete graduate level studies in the United States.

Engineering degrees, such as Bachelor of Engineering and Bachelor of Technology are four year programs, which give access to Master of Engineering and Master of Technology programs in India.

Higher education reforms in India by the government mean that the system of education is changing; therefore, we will expect to see students complete four year B.S. and B.A. degree programs. Some institutions have already launched such programs, with successful graduates already applying to graduate programs in the United States.

England and Wales

Students who receive their bachelor's degree from English or Welsh universities typically complete their degree in three years. These degrees are differentiated from most other three year degrees as the student will have been required to complete A-Levels for admission to the program. A-levels are intensive two year programs which once completed can be considered to hold college credit in the United States.

Degrees from Scotland are typically of four years duration with a broader educational focus than the English/Welsh degree.

Canada/Australia/New Zealand South Africa

Generally students with three year bachelor's degrees from Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa are not programs which give access to graduate study in these countries. To be eligible for admission to a graduate program students need to enroll in and complete an 'honours degree', which is usually a one year program following the completion of the three year bachelors. Alternatively students can be admitted to extended masters degree programs, with an additional year of study.

ASU Admission Services will accept three year programs from Canada/Australia/New Zealand and South Africa as acceptable for admission review, even in such cases where they may not be eligible in the awarding country.

Advisory

The above information is intended to be used as a guide only and is not a complete list of all possible three year credentials. All transcripts and credentials will be evaluated for equivalency at the time of admission review, by ASU Admission Services.
